This year's Forum is the 5th of these events that we do annually to bring together the various players in the Ghanaian social enterprise ecosystem composed of players from academia, research, students, investors, policy makers and government officials, donors and funders and the social entrepreneurs.

In 2020, in the midst of Covid-19 pandemic and with support from BUSAC, British Council and Reach for Change we organised the Forum that explored the Social Enterprise Policy and the need for an enabling environment for social enterprises. In 2021 we had the Director from the Ministry of Finance and we looked at the Ghana Social Enterprise Fund to drive investment into social enterprises. # ACTIVATE

ACCELERATING CHANGE THROUGH INNOVATION IN AGRICULTURAL TVET



Social Enterprise Ghana, in collaboration with the World University Service of Canada (WUSC), is advancing the five-year ACTIVATE Project, funded by Mastercard Foundation, to train and provide decent jobs for 80,000 youth, with 70% of them being females focused on Agriculture TVET and adjacent sectors. Key activities includes a nationwide scoping exercise, a two-day Stakeholder Consultative Workshop, and a Disability Inclusion Workshop facilitated by the Ghana Federation of Disability Organisations (GFD). An onboarding session with the Mastercard Foundation and a MERL workshop focused on project indicators, data collection, and reporting procedures. Over 75 hubs and training centers participated in an online orientation, and a two-week field visit to assess regional partners' readiness. Social Enterprise Ghana organized Online workshops on safeguarding, mental health awareness, and financial management to equip partners with essential skills.

Social Enterprise Ghana has partnered with Skills Initiative for Africa (SIFA) to train young females in green and digital skills for job and enterprise creation (FEMGREEN). Currently the project has trained about 550 participants both online and inperson in areas such as Quickbooks, Graphic Design, Business Management, Human Resource, Health Insurance and Recalibrating your small business for success. Training is ongoing and Social Enterprise Ghana is looking at training another 500 in the next few months.

Under this project, Social Enterprise Ghana also attended the Skills Initiative for Africa (SIFA) workshop organized in Johannesburg, South Africa for their various partners. The workshop covered topics including market validation, grant management, milestone project management and reimbursement and also fostered knowledge sharing among participants.

The Females In Green and Digital Skills for Jobs and Enterprise Creation project is with support from African Union Commission, NEPAD and KFW and seeks to provide

vocational and entrepreneurship skills to young females.



Social Enterprise Ghana in partnership with Zomujo Foundation organized an online workshop on how small business owners can achieve a harmonious work balance, manage stress effectively and boost their overall wellbeing. Some topics covered included overall health including physical, spiritual, mental, etc. The workshop also touched on the causes of mental health, signs and symptoms of mental health issues, and also how we can protect our mental health as entrepreneurs.





Social Enterprise Ghana organized a one-week digital skills training in Graphic Design and E-Commerce for 20 young people for their business growth and employability under the Skills-For-Job Project. Participants were awarded of Participation and they will be connected to job opportunities with Social Enterprise Ghana Members and other ecosystem players. This initiative underscores Social Enterprise Ghana's commitment to fostering inclusive opportunities

and empowering the next generation.





Social Enterprise Ghana, in partnership with Brands and Klicks and Kaya App, organized an online workshop focused on how small business owners can build impactful brands that resonate with their audience and fuel business growth. The workshop covered essential topics, including how branding shapes public perception, fosters trust, and enhances a business's market position. Participants also gained valuable insights on creating a brand identity that effectively communicates a business's values and vision. Additionally, the session touched on strategies for standing out in a competitive market and fostering long-term customer loyalty. Entrepreneurs left with actionable tools to develop authentic and sustainable brands for continued growth of their businesses.

Social Enterprise Ghana partnered with Trade Facilitation Office (TFO) Canada to develop export oriented women social entrepreneurs to improve their capacity to participate in international trade.

Social Enterprise Ghana as part of its partnership, the program also supported these social enterprises to be export ready and take advantage of international markets.

Also, these enterprises received Internationally recognized Branding support for their businesses. About 50 women social entrepreneurs were also trained to be export ready.

The training was facilitated by Professor Valerie Bell, an international business consultant from Catalyste+ Canada. The program had other partners including Access Bank, Africa Trade Academy, IBEE Germany.

#### **GHANA SOCIAL ENTERPRISE POLICY DIALOGUE 2024**

Social Enterprise Ghana, in collaboration with GIZ AgriBiz, hosted the Ghana Social Enterprise Policy Dialogue 2024 at the Airport View Hotel. The event brought together key stakeholders, including academia, social entrepreneurs, government agencies, and the private sector, to discuss the progress and challenges surrounding the passage of the Social Enterprise Policy in Ghana.

Prof. Ernest Ofori Asamoah, a research consultant, delivered a presentation on "Redesigning Public-Private Dialogues for Results: Rethinking Social Enterprise Ghana's Advocacy Strategy." He highlighted the importance of social enterprises focusing on a niche agenda to drive the adoption of the Social Enterprise Policy.

The Ministry of Trade and Industry provided an update on the policy's progress and outlined the next steps. Additionally, panel discussions were held on "The Ghana Social Enterprise Fund" and "Allocating a Quota for the Procurement of Social Goods."









#### SOCIAL ENTERPRISE GHANA CONDUCTS TRAINING OF TRAINERS IN FOOD CERTIFICATION, PACKAGING AND BRANDING

Social Enterprise Ghana, in collaboration with GIZ AgriBiz and USAID GTI, organized a Training of Trainers (ToT) workshop for its staff and regional representatives nationwide. The workshop brought together 20 Business Development Service providers and hubs, focusing on food product certification, packaging, and branding.







Social Enterprise Ghana, in partnership with GIZ, organized E-commerce training program for 120 women entrepreneurs in Pan African E-Commerce Initiative (PECI). The project was conducted in four cohorts, the training brought together 120 young female social and green entrepreneurs equipping them with essential skills in digital trade to enhance their business operations and expand market access.

Facilitators guided participants through key E-commerce strategies, digital marketing techniques, sustainable packaging methods, and online business development skills.























## **VALIDATION WORKSHOP**







Social Enterprise Ghana, with support from the European Union Investment Climate Reforms Facility (ICR), organized a Validation Workshop on the "Feasibility Study on Social Enterprise and Innovation Fund" at the British Council on January 25, 2024.

The workshop brought together key stakeholders in the social enterprise ecosystem to explore strategies for mobilizing investment, particularly for women-led and green-focused social enterprises. We extend our gratitude to our partners—the European Union, British Council, GIZ AgriBiz, Star Ghana Foundation, World University Services Canada, and Accra Technical University—for their invaluable support in driving this initiative. Special thanks to Challenges Group Ghana for conducting this research and engaging stakeholders to spark discussions on investing in social enterprises.

We also appreciate the participation of government agencies, representatives from the Ghana Venture Capital Trust Fund, Development Bank of Ghana, network members, media, and panelists who contributed to the success of this event.

Social Enterprise Ghana, with support from Star Ghana Foundation, held a strategic meeting with 20 regional representatives, hubs, and training centers to review its five-year strategy. This initiative was part of the Star Ghana Foundation's Civil Society Strengthening Program—Shift the Power.

Participants provided valuable feedback on Social Enterprise Ghana's strategy, plans, and activities, as well as insights on the effective execution of its flagship project, ACTIVATE.


